Last night the Husbutch and I had one of the most memorable dining experiences that we've had since we moved to the Keys. In the nearly decade that we have lived here we've probably tried just about every restaurant there is available on the island. That being said we had yet to find a place that felt like our Cheers. There are quite a few that we enjoy but none that really hit the spot. A bar or restaurant that we walk into and it feels comfortable, with high-quality food, smiling faces and just felt like home. We recently had that experience and you need to try it, too.

If you've been to the Keys more than once you've likely had someone recommend to you a slew of different restaurants to try. Louie's Backyard is famous for celebrity sightings, Four Marlins at The Reach resort is very popular because it's located on the only natural beach on the whole island, Milagro is another stunner with a modern take on Latin fare that is absolutely outstanding and at some point someone has probably said "have you ever been to the Square Grouper?" If the answer is no this is your sign that it's finally time.

The food at the Square Grouper located on Cudjoe Key is so good that we would occasionally choose to drive up the keys a little over 20 miles just to go to dinner. The atmosphere is playing very heavily on the traditional tongue-in-cheek name for a catch that a sailor might find washed up on the beach. For those of you who have never seen a grouper before allow me to assure you that they are never square in shape. While they are a tremendously tasty fish that is not what this is referring to. To this day if someone is walking along a beach and finds a tightly wrapped square bale washed up on shore, it is likely not a fish at all. In fact, a square grouper is what we call a bale of marijuana that has washed up. It's pretty rare, to be sure, but it does in fact happen. referring to it as a square grouper rather than what it is was a sailors way of letting other sailors know that they had found something illegal in nature that needed to be turned into the authorities, of course. All done with a play on words harkening back to old island tradition and interesting history. Just good fun, really. There is even an aquarium filled with several, albeit fake, bundles of square grouper at this restaurant of the Keys. Fresh catch is their specialty and that morning's catch of stone crab claws and wonderful fish spread in abundance await you. But this isn't even the best part...

The best part is that now rather than having to drive 20+ miles up the keys to go to dinner, all you have to do is walk down Caroline Street. The Square Grouper opened a second location in Key West in January and us locals are here for it! There was a wonderful restaurant in this spot for many years that deserves to be noted, Off The Hook. It was run by a fantastic couple and definitely catered to the local pallet. When that restaurant closed the Square Grouper owners stepped in. The space has had a complete overhaul from floor to ceiling and the theme is on point!! The light colored wormwood floors and walls soften the large open space of the front room. When I walked in I had to snoop around to see all of the changes and when I entered the back room I found a brand new raw bar nestled in a three person claw-foot bathtub! The space is light, airy, fresh and uncharacteristically sparkling clean for a Keys restaurant. We shared an appetizer that I'm not sure I can ever forget of goat cheese dates and honey with almond slivers on top while we waited for our food. I ordered the seared Ahi tuna with jasmine rice and a sauce that I had never had before call ponzu. Let me just tell you, that was a religious experience. I'll never have soy sauce ever again. It's ponzu for me all the way. If you're like me and have never had ponzu, or ever even heard of it, it is a citrus vinaigrette made with some soy sauce and fresh citrus that you dip the fish into and I probably could've eaten that with a spoon alone. It was out of this world. It was so good I could barely pay attention to what the Husbutch had for dinner. Oh yes, it was fresh diver scallops. They looked fantastic but I was far too into my own meal too pay close attention.

As it turned out a couple of friends made a last-minute decision to go there for dinner as well and we saw them shortly before our meal was delivered to our table. So we took our dessert over to their table and finished up our meal conversing with friends and having the hummingbird cake which was as sweet and delicious as you can possibly imagine.

As the meal came to a close I looked over at my spouse and said that I believed we had found our home away from home finally. The Square Grouper's second location on 920 Caroline Street on Key West opens at 5 PM and is worth jumping in line outside to get into. Trust me, they have the room to seat everyone, it's just that popular that people line up early. So Lez Go Out and enjoy a little square grouper together. See you at the bar!


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


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


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"WHEN THE BAND PLAYED ON: THE LIFE OF RANDY SHILTS, AMERICA'S TRAILBLAZING GAY JOURNALIST" BY MICHAEL G. LEE

You spent most of your early career playing second fiddle.

But now you've got the baton, and a story to tell that people aren't going to want to hear, though it's essential that they face the music. They must know what's happening. As in the new book "When the Band Played On" by Michael G. Lee, this time, it's personal.

Born in 1951 in small-town Iowa, Randy Shilts was his alcoholic, abusive mother's third of six sons. Frustrated, drunk, she reportedly beat Shilts almost daily when he was young; she also called him a

when he was young; she also called him a "sissy," which "seemed to follow Randy everywhere."

Perhaps because of the abuse, Shilts had to "teach himself social graces," developing "adultlike impassiveness" and "biting sarcasm," traits that featured strongly as he matured and became a writer. He was exploring his sexuality then, learning "the subtleties of sexual communication," while sleeping with women before fully coming out as gay to friends.

Nearing his twenty-first birthday, Shilts moved to Oregon to attend college and to "allow myself love." There, he became somewhat of an activist before leaving San Francisco to fully pursue journalism, focusing on stories of gay life that were "mostly unknown to anyone outside of gay culture."

He would bounce between Oregon and California several times, though he never lost sight of his writing career and, through it, his activism. In both states, Shilts reported on gay life, until he was well-known to national readers and gay influencers. After San Francisco supervisor Harvey Milk was assassinated, he was tapped to write Milk's biography.

By 1982, Shilts was in love, had a book under his belt, a radio gig, and a regular byline in a national publication reporting "on the GRID beat," an acronym later changed to AIDS. He was even under contract to write a second book.

But Shilts was careless. Just once, careless.

"In hindsight," says Lee, "... it was likely the night when Randy crossed the line, becoming more a part of the pandemic than just another worried bystander."

Perhaps not surprisingly, there are two distinct audiences for "When the Band Played On." One type of reader will remember the AIDS crisis and the seminal book about it. The other is too young to remember it, but needs to know Randy Shilts' place in its history.

The journey may be different, the result is the same: author Michael G. Lee tells a complicated, still-controversial story of Shilts and the book that made America pay attention, and it's edgy for modern eyes. Lee clearly shows why Shilts had fans and haters, why Shilts was who he was, and Lee keeps some mystery in the tale: Shilts had the knowledge to keep himself safe but he apparently didn't, and readers are left to wonder why. There's uncomfortable tension in that, and a lot of hypothetical thinking to be had.

For scholars of gay history, this is an essential book to read. Also, for anyone too young to remember AIDS as it was, "When the Band Played On" hits the right note.

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


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TALK TO THE ANIMALS

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


