There's nothing like sitting with your love on a padded bench seat of an old wooden schooner while she tilts heavily toward the starboard side and makes you snuggle even closer while watching the sunset. It really is magical! We have been on so many that now when the other passengers are anxiously waiting for the sun to hit the horizon (and possibly witness a green flash) we steal a romantic kiss. The glow of the sun reflected on the water turning pink and orange is a darn aphrodisiac. Trust me.

Now, when choosing your vessel for the evening, there are several to choose from in several different sizes, colors and with different accessories to make you happy. Get your mind out of the gutter and back on the deck where it belongs. A schooner we have sailed on several times and absolutely love would be the Appledore. Their champagne sunset sail has appetizers, shrimp cocktail and their famous tropical sangria! They often sail over by the infamous Mallory Square, Fort Zachary and the Navy Mole. It is romantic to say the least and really a great fit for couples and those looking for an intimate celebration and attentive crew. Or if you just want to snuggle and kiss through the whole sunet. It's perfect right down to the way the deck creaks and snaps gently as she sways from side to side.

If you like to party while on the water, choose between Danger and Fury! There are bands, blended drinks, dancing and a catamaran large enough for the whole troupe you're vacationing with. This is the PARTY on the water. It's all about getting your groove on while sailing far away from the island and seeing deep water with Key West always in view. The drinks flow freely and everyone is feeling good!

There is a special option for those who like the catamaran but not the booming beats while enjoying their sunset. This one can be rented out for a private party, or you can join the preestablished sailing times but either way this boat brings the class and sophistication to the sunset experience in Key West. This is the Argo Navis. The inside of this glorious ship is a living space with wood features and I think they put an orchid on everything. They're just that posh. You just feel fancy stepping aboard and the cushy seats with that private yacht feeling make the experience!


For those who want a somewhat Disney-like experience while you watch the butter ball drop, I recommend the Jolly II Rover. Crimson red sails that can been seen from almost anywhere on the water, the 80' tall ship and her square-rigged top sail bring about thoughts of pirates, rum and open seas while you sail through the harbor right toward the sun. The captain will even let you take your turn at the wheel and steer her toward the glow! As the sun hits the waterline the captain will fire the cannon to celebrate and ward off privateers in the vicinity. He's kind enough to give you a heads up because the boom will make your heart stop if you aren't ready for it! It's really a phenomenal experience and we highly recommend it. The cannon, not the heart stopping, of course.

And of course, we have our very own GAY Catamaran the Blu Q! They provide a light snack, water and it is BYOB so you can chill your own bottle of Grey Goose, drop it in their cooler onboard and sip away as the sun goes down. All over 18+ are welcome and it's a great way to meet other LGBTQ people while on the island. They have *interesting* daytime activities for the gentlemen and host a women's only sail during Women's Week as well. We love to promote and support LGBTQ owned businesses and this one is a peach.

Seeing the island drenched in the afterglow of a Key West sunset is breathtaking and as far as we're concerned, one of the best ways to spend and evening in Key West. You know that if a local goes more than once (and we certainly have) it must be great. So, Lez Go Out and enjoy sunset with family, "family" and friends. 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
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
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


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"NOTHING EVER JUST DISAPPEARS: SEVEN HIDDEN QUEER HISTORIES" By Diarmuid Hester

Where that is comes to mind immediately: a palatial home with soaring windows, or a humble cabin in a glen, a ramshackle treehouse, a window seat, a coffeehouse table, or just a bed with a special blanket. It's the place where your mind unspools and creativity surges, where you relax, process, and think. It's the spot where, as in the new book "Nothing Ever Just Disappears" by Diarmuid Hester, you belong.

Clinging "to a spit of land on the south-east coast of England" is Prospect Cottage, where artist and filmmaker Derek Jarman lived until he died of AIDS

in 1994. It's a simple four-room place, but it was important to him. Not long ago, Hester visited Prospect Cottage to "examine the importance of queer places in the history of arts and culture."

So many "queer spaces" are disappearing. Still, we can talk about those that aren't.

In his classic book, Maurice, writer E.M. Forster imagined the lives of two men who loved one another but could never be together, and their romantic meeting near a second-floor window. The novel, when finished, "proved too radical even for Forster himself"; he didn't "allow" its publication until after he was dead.

"Patriarchal power," says Hester, largely controlled who was able to occupy certain spots in London at the turn of the last century. Still,

"queer suffragettes" there managed to leave their mark: women like Vera Holme, chauffeur to suffragette leader Emmeline Pankhurst; writer Virginia Woolf; newspaperwoman Edith Craig, and others who "made enormous contributions to the cause."

Josephine Baker grew up in poverty, learning to dance to keep warm, but she had Paris, the city that "made her into a star..." Artist and "transgender icon" Claude Cahun loved Jersey, the place where she worked to "show just how much gender is masquerade." Writer James Baldwin felt most at home in a small town in France. B-filmmaker Jack Smith embraced New York – and vice versa. And on a personal journey, Hester mourns his friend, artist Kevin Killian, who lived and died in his beloved San Francisco.

Juxtaposing place and person, "Nothing Ever Just Disappears" features an interesting way of presenting the idea that both are intertwined deeper than it may seem at first glance. The point is made with grace and lyrical prose, in a storyteller's manner that offers back-story and history as author Diarmuid Hester bemoans the loss of "queer spaces." This is really a lovely, meaningful book – though readers may argue the points made as they pass through the places included here. Landscapes change with history all the time; don't modern "queer spaces" count?

That's a fair question to ask, one that could bring these "hidden" histories full-circle: we often preserve important monuments from history. In memorializing the actions of the queer artists who've worked for the future, the places that inspired them are worth enshrining, too.

Reading this book may be the most relaxing, soothing thing you'll do this month. Try "Nothing Ever Just Disappears" because it really hits the spot.

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
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PEARLY WHITES




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
