# LEZ GO OUT



July in Key West is not for the faint of heart. It's for the women who can handle heat, humidity, and the kind of sunshine that feels like it's personally trying to date you. It's for the lesbians who know that slow season isn't a lull — it's an invitation. An invitation to breathe, to wander, to flirt, to sweat (a lot), and to fall in love with the island all over again.

There's something deliciously queer about July here. Maybe it's the way the air wraps around you like a warm hug from a butch auntie who smells faintly of sunscreen and boat fuel. Maybe it's the way the island finally exhales after the chaos of Pride month, settling into a rhythm that feels softer, slower, and a little more intimate. Or maybe it's just the mangoes. Honestly, it might be the mangoes.

Because let's be real: Mango Fest is the true star of July. Pride may have the parades and the glitter, but Mango Fest has the juice — literally. The whole island turns into a celebration of this sweet local fruit, and every lesbian suddenly becomes a self-proclaimed mango sommelier. You'll see women in sundresses or cargo shorts holding frozen mango daiquiris, comparing notes like they're judging a wine competition. You'll overhear sentences like, "This one has great mouthfeel," and you'll pretend not to blush. Mango Fest is sticky, sweet, and just a little bit chaotic, which is exactly why it feels like home.

And then there's the Fourth of July, which in Key West is less about patriotism and more about gathering on the pier with your chosen family, watching fireworks explode over the water while someone's butch wife insists she knows a better spot and leads everyone on a mildly illegal detour. The whole island glows — not just from the fireworks, but from the way people soften around each other. Couples lean in. Friends share drinks. Strangers become temporary companions. It's the kind of night that reminds you why queer people have always found refuge here. Freedom isn't just a word; it's a feeling you can taste in the salt air.

Just when you think July can't get any more delightfully unhinged, Hemingway Days arrives — a week where the island is suddenly overrun with bearded men in

khaki, all convinced they look exactly like Papa himself. It's camp, it's chaos, and it's unintentionally queer in the best way. There's something deeply satisfying about watching a herd of Hemingway look alikes sweating through their shirts while a group of lesbians in linen shorts and sensible sandals stroll by unfazed. The running of the bulls reenactment? Iconic. The look alike contest? A masterclass in masculinity as performance. The whole thing feels like Key West winking at itself, reminding us that this island has always been a little theatrical, a little wild, and very comfortable with people reinventing themselves.

Of course, July also brings the kind of heat that makes every lesbian reconsider her relationship with denim shorts. The humidity is a character in its own right — bold, unapologetic, and determined to make your hair do whatever it wants. But there's something oddly charming about it. The heat slows you down, forces you to linger, encourages you to slip into a cool bar — with Laurie T slinging drinks for you — in the middle of the afternoon and call it “self care.” And honestly, it is.

Slow season is when the island's women owned and queer friendly spots really shine. You can actually get a seat at Frenchie's Café without elbowing a tourist. You can wander into Viv Wine Bar and have a real conversation with the bartender, who probably knows your wife's drink order and your dog's name. You can sit on the shaded patio of Back Bar with a cold drink and feel like the island is yours — not in a possessive way, but in that tender, familiar way that only comes from living in a place that loves you back.

And that's the thing about July: it's quieter, but it's not empty. It's slower, but it's not dull. It's hot, but it's the kind of heat that softens you rather than wears you down. After the rainbow soaked whirlwind of June, July feels like the afterglow — warm, lingering, and deeply satisfying. The flags are still up. The painted fences are still bright. The island is still proudly, defiantly queer. Pride doesn't get packed away here; it just shifts into a different gear.

July in Key West is for the lesbians who love a little sweat, a little fruit, and a lot of freedom. It's for the women who know that community isn't just built in parades — it's built in quiet afternoons, shared cocktails, mango sticky fingers, and fireworks reflected in the eyes of someone you love. It's for anyone who understands that this island isn't just a place to live; it's a place to belong. So, Lez Go Out and celebrate our freedom to love and live openly on this little island. See you at the fireworks. I'll be following my husbutch into potentially restricted areas.

You do.

Or maybe you don't. Or you did once and said never again because, as you know, marriage isn't for everyone; in fact, it's the rare couple that stays hitched for the long-term. So did you – or didn't you? Either way, check out “For Better and Worse” by Stephanie Coontz and see how marriage as an institution has been through sickness and health.

It's considered by most Americans to be one of the most important forms of commitment that two adults can make together.

And, says Coontz, eventually, most of us do make that commitment by getting married. Today, though, we do it later than did Americans in the past. She says that's perhaps because, as studies indicate, people worry today that they won't have the kind of union that they want.

So how did we get here?

In ancient times, if a person wanted to formalize a union with someone else, there were options: different cultures practiced polyandry, polygamy, same-sex marriage, and even marriage between a living person and a dead one. Some of those unions, by the way, are still practiced by certain societies, including ours.

In the earliest years of Christianity, total celibacy was the pinnacle of

morality, according to Church leaders, and so marriage wasn't encouraged. Minds were changed, though: by the early thirteenth century, marriage became a sacrament, and abstinence was considered to be a danger to one's health.

In Medieval times, marriage was an expectation, often an arrangement for political purposes with the hope that the couple could at least get along. In the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, marriage was much more equal, perhaps, than it was in the 1950s. Later, marriage became patriarchal, and women were fully expected to "obey" their husbands. Marriage precursors were courting and dating, the definitions of which changed; meanwhile, men sometimes slept with men and birthrates for unmarried women waxed and waned.

And on that note, wait til you read about mother's "lover" in the nineteenth century...

How many wedding invitations have you gotten this year? One, three, more? No matter: "For Better and Worse" will give you plenty of topics for small-talk at the reception.

In her introduction, author Stephanie Coontz says that this book is not an encouragement for marriage, nor is it a warning. Instead, she shows how the institution of marriage has changed over the centuries, in an informative but still lighthearted way that's quite delightful. Readers who think they know what a "traditional" marriage is may be shocked to see what actually was traditional; there's validation here, if you want it – and surprise, if you don't.

There's something inside "For Better and Worse" for feminists eschewing the institution, for LGBTQ readers who are thinking about marriage, and history and happy tales for anyone who proudly stands next to a partner of many years. It won't change your mind about the ceremony or the union, but it may make you see controversy more clearly.

In this month for weddings, don't you need a book like this?

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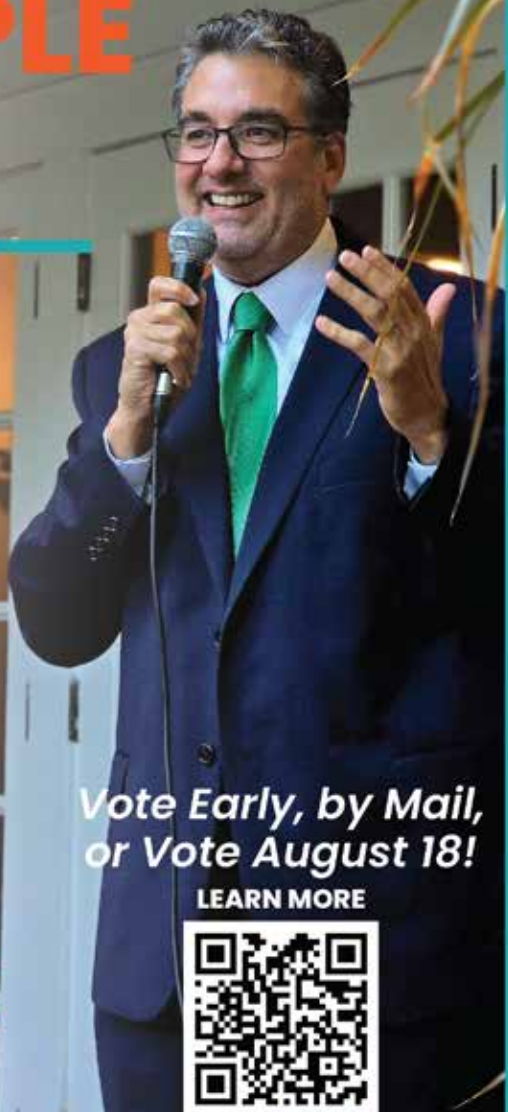
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# MY BIG GAY LIFE
